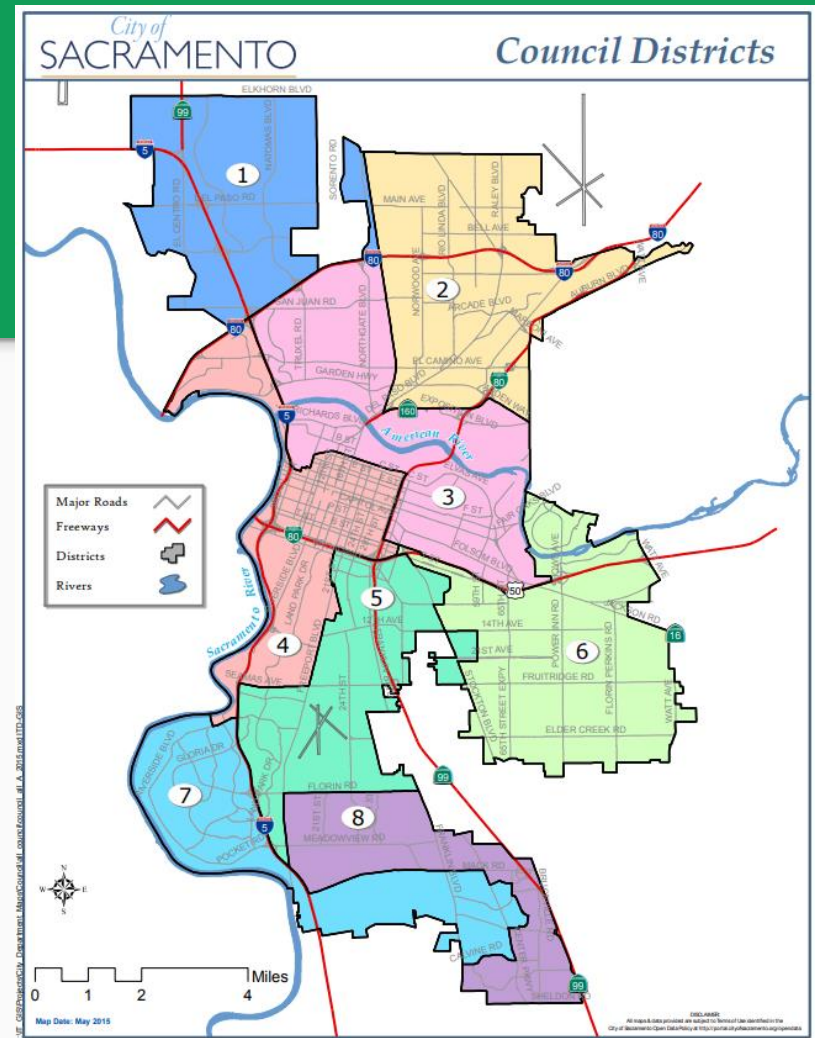

## A. Mayor's Ask of Councilmembers

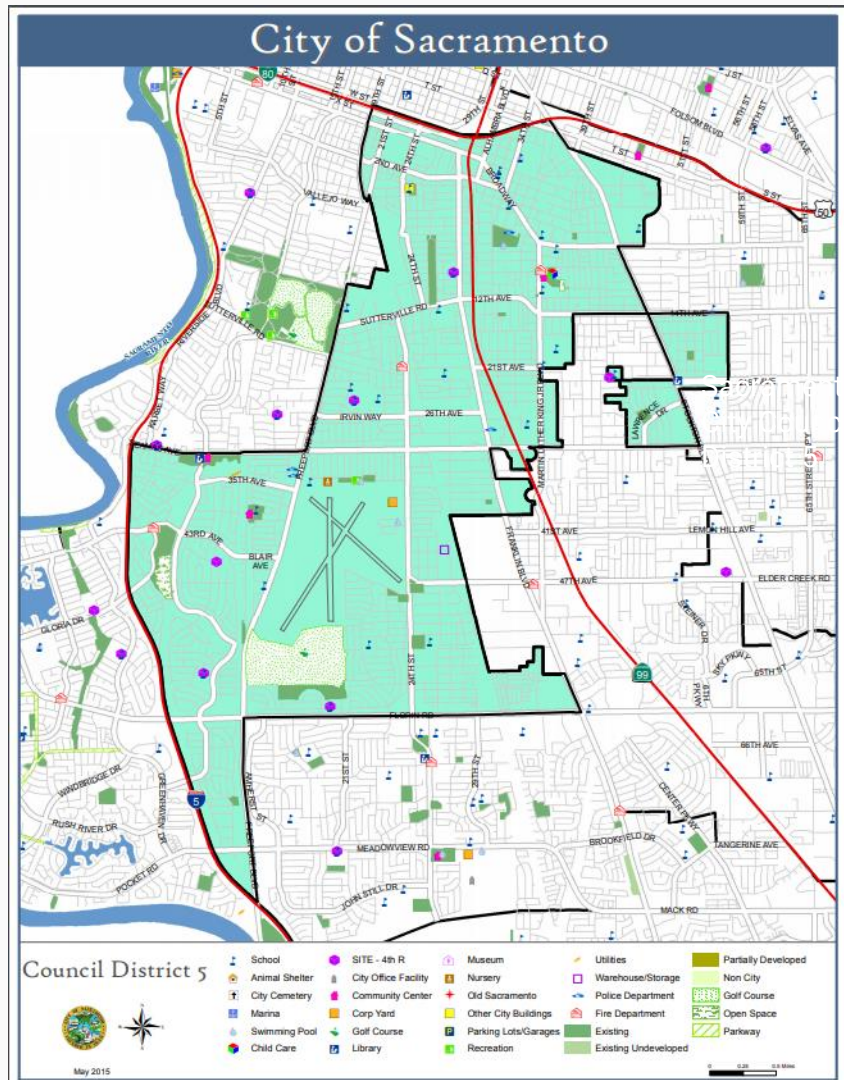
- a. Identify sites suitable to accommodate 100 beds per district = 800 beds

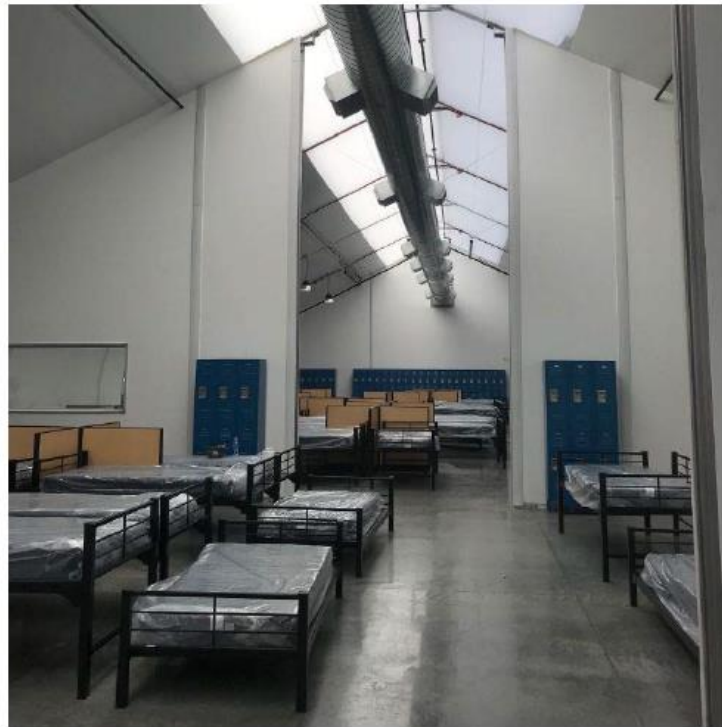

- Sprung structure
- Bathroom and shower facilities
- Mobile trailers, converted storage containers
- 100 beds
- Space for pets
- Onsite parking for employees

# Who is allowed into the shelter?

## Low-barrier:

- By referral only
- Adults - over 18
- Pets, possessions, and partners
- Does not discriminate based on mental health, substance abuse, or criminal record

# What Happens In and Around the Site?

## Services Provided to Shelter Guests:

- Meals
- Laundry
- Showers
- Case management
- Legal aid
- Medical care
- Veterinary care
- Veterans' services
- Benefit Acquisition
- Pathways to Health +  
Home enrollment/services

# What Happens In and Around the Site?

## Daily Routine of Shelter Guests:

- 24/7 Security and Staff
- 3 meals a day
- Varies based on guest needs - appointments with services, etc.

# How Will This Impact Our Neighborhoods?

- Primary focus: neighborhoods and businesses along the Broadway and I-80 corridors
- Downtown Streets Team partnership
- City Solid Waste

# Will Our Neighborhoods and Kids be Safe?

## Onsite:

- Enclosed fencing
- Security cameras monitoring all on-site facilities.
- 24/7 Shelter staff
- Curfew hours for shelter guests

# Will Our Neighborhoods and Kids be Safe?

## Offsite:

- City of Sacramento Police patrols in the neighborhoods
- IMPACT team

# How Do We Hold the City Accountable?
